From Jean Louis of Kanpèch, Port Salut

I greet you! My name is Jean Louis but here everyone calls me Jean-Jean. I live in the locality of Kanpèch in the commune of Port Salut. I would like to express all my gratitude to Water For Life and its team because you have taken the community of Kanpèch to heart.

We were in an extremely difficult situation when it came to finding water for drinking and for our daily use (hygiene and domestic). It was the same difficulty to give water to our animals. When cholera struck the region again, many people unfortunately died because the water we had access to, several kilometers away, was contaminated. It was really a terrible time for the community. We had to walk for three hours to access a spring. When it rained, the path became impassable; even our goats could not use the path. In the case of bad weather, a ravine would suddenly form, cutting the road, and it became impossible to get clean water to drink. We had no choice; we were forced to use the impure water we found and try to boil it before drinking it.

But today, thanks to God, our situation has changed. You thought of us, you came to help the community. So, all of us, we say thank you and we ask God to bless you abundantly in all areas of your life.

From Patricia of St. Georges, Saint Louis du Sud

Hello, my name is Patricia Sainvilca, and I live in Saint Georges Hills. Previously, in our locality water was really a



problem. We had to buy water to drink and when we needed to wash ourselves, we had to use a little of this water. When we did not have enough, it was impossible to wash and therefore

impossible to go to work clean, as normally expected. We then had to find water very far from home, in some distant sources. We had to carry this water from very far away to drink, wash ourselves etc. When it happened that the water supply ran out, it was impossible for us to cook as well, until we made the long journey again.



There is no greater gift for the locality than the water

that Water For Life has made available.

Our community was denigrated by everyone; people made fun of us saying that we lived in a desert, that we would never have water in the region.

Well today, thanks to Water For Life, we have water in the community, and we are going to protect this well as if it were a newborn baby that had been entrusted to us. We say a big thank you to Water For Life!

Computer Science Classes in Our Center

In our mission to spread the love of Christ, we were thrilled to set up a computer lab in the Life Learning Center. This new learning space is more than just walls and computers; it represents hope and opportunity. Equipped with around twenty computers, the children now have a place to dive into various subjects. With the guidance of our IT specialists, they are exploring everything from English courses to computer skills for now, and before long they will be trained for a new program called "Opportunities Without Borders (OWB)".

OWB is an upcoming training program that we are preparing to implement in the Life Learning Center which can help train young people in technology professions without any tuition fees. This can pave the way for a brighter future.

Deprived of access to electricity, internet, and computers, these youth are extremely grateful for this opportunity to learn a little more each day, thanks to these computers. They never cease to express their gratitude for this new learning center.
